# Horseheads Animal Shelter

## The Small Shelter with A Big Heart!

The Horseheads Animal Shelter, located at 150 Wygant Road, behind the Town Hall, would like to welcome everyone to come visit and possibly take home a lifelong friend! The Horseheads Animal Shelter is run by Frank Rosplock, the Dog Control Officer and Shelter Manager, his devoted staff and local volunteers who strive to find suitable, warm, loving homes for every animal that finds its way to the shelter.

To ensure that every animal finds a great home, you must first fill out an application, if you are granted authorization to adopt; you are then able to choose a lifelong companion! Along with your new pet, your family will also be sent home with information about how to care for and properly treat your pet in the form of a helpful DVD as well as pet food and treats. The Animal Shelter only asks that if for any reason your new pet does not fit in with your family that it be returned to the shelter, so that you may be assisted in finding a more suitable animal and that the returned animal will be able to find a new home.

In order to care for the 200 pets that are adopted each year, donations are accepted and appreciated. The Horseheads Animal Shelter does have a *Wish List* that can be picked up at the shelter. The Animal Shelter is always looking for the following items: dog collars (preferably with metal buckles, small and average sizes), disposable latex gloves (large), knuckle bones, old used carpet, laundry detergent, wood shavings, cat carriers (old or new) and clean straw. All donations are accepted, whether it is a small personal donation or donations that are collected by schools or other groups!

After visiting the Horseheads Animal Shelter, you will come away with the feeling that even though the shelter is small in size, the people there have a big heart for animals! The shelter is a pit stop for the animals that come through; the animals there are very happy and loveable and the staff goes above and beyond most municipal animal shelters. The Animal Shelter is not a bad place; it is just a stepping stone which provides people with a healthy, happy, lifelong friend! The job in itself is very rewarding for the staff and volunteers! It is a sad time to see an animal go because of the friendship that was developed, but it is great to find a loving home for the pet.

So feel free to head down to the Horseheads Animal Shelter and visit with Frank and his staff Monday through Friday between 8:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m. or after hours by appointment.
